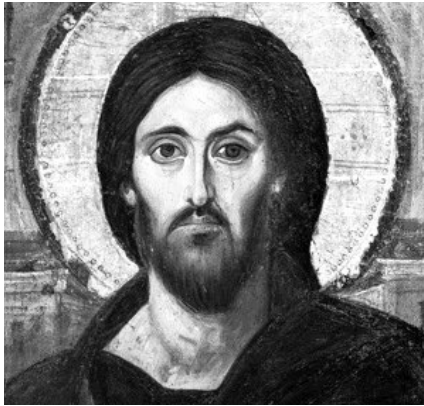

POPE: CHURCH'S MISSION IS TO ATTRACT PEOPLE TO CHRIST, NOT PROSELYTIZE

October 5th, 2016 – The Catholic Universe reported that Pope Francis said Christians are called to follow the example of Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, who helped draw people to Jesus by way of attraction, not by proselytizing. She is a reminder that an authentic witness is proclaimed through a union with Christ "in prayer, adoration and in concrete charity, which is serving Jesus, who is present in the least of our brothers and sisters," he said. Addressing some former prisoners of the Auschwitz concentration camp and Polish pilgrims present, he said the day's feast of Saint Faustina Kowalska "reminded the world that God is rich in mercy and that his love is more powerful than death, than sin and every evil." In his main audience talk, Pope Francis reflected on his visit to Georgia and

Azerbaijan, which took place from September 30th through October 2nd. Recalling Mass in Tbilisi on October 1st to celebrate the feast of Saint Thérèse, the patroness of the missions, the pope said, "This is what the religious men and women I met in Tbilisi do, as well as in Baku: They do it with prayer and charitable works. I encouraged them to be steadfast in the faith with memory, courage and hope."

Although both countries celebrated the 25th anniversary of their independence from the Soviet regime, they still "face numerous difficulties in different aspects of social life" and the Catholic Church, in collaboration with other churches and Christian communities are called to be "a sign of charity and human development", he said. "In Georgia, this mission naturally passes through the collaboration with our Orthodox brothers and sisters, who form the vast majority of the populations," the pope said. Pope Francis said a "very important sign" of this collaboration was the presence of Orthodox Patriarch Ilia II at the airport upon his arrival as well as their meeting at Svetitskhoveli Cathedral, which houses the seamless tunic of Jesus, a garment the pope described as a "symbol of unity of the Church."

"This unity is supported by the blood of so many martyrs of different Christian confessions." Pope Francis said the celebration of the Eucharist and the interreligious meeting in Baku were proof that "faith knows how to maintain the right relationship" between different faiths and expressed his hope that through this unity, the people of the Caucasus may "live in peace and mutual respect." The Eucharist is "where the spirit harmonizes different languages and gives the strength of witness" which creates communion in Christ and drives Christians to "seek an encounter and dialogue with all who believe in God, to build together a more just and fraternal world."

At Mary's School Living the Mass

The Annunciation scene as recorded by Luke follows the order of the Mass. Have you ever noticed this?

First, there is the angel's greeting, like the celebrant who greets the congregation: "Dominus vobiscum, the Lord is with you!" Then the emotion of the Virgin that corresponds to the penitential liturgy. Her listening to the message of the angel is like the Liturgy of the Word. And each homily should be an answer to the Virgin's question, "How will this happen?" How will the proclaimed Word take flesh in our lives? The only possible answer is that of the angel: "The Holy Spirit will come upon you." This is the epiclesis of the Mass. (The epiclesis is the part of the Eucharistic Prayer in which the priest calls down the Holy Spirit upon the offerings of bread and wine.)

The same Holy Spirit who gives Mary the ability to conceive the flesh of the Son of God changes the bread and the wine into the Body and the Blood of the Lord. What excitement is contained in Mary's response: "Fiat. Oh yes, so be it!" Is it not with the same lover's eagerness that the communicant says a resounding "Amen" when the priest presents the Body of Christ to him? "Then the angel left her." This is the time of the dismissal: "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life!"

October, the Month of the Holy Rosary

The Fifteen Promises of Mary Granted to those who Recite the Rosary

The Blessed Virgin Mary promised to Saint Dominic and to all who follow, that "Whatever you ask in the Rosary will be granted." She left for all Christians Fifteen Promises to those who recite the Holy Rosary.

Imparted to Saint Dominic and Blessed Alan

1. Whoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall receive signal graces.
2. I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the Rosary.
3. The Rosary shall be a powerful armor against hell, it will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies.
4. The Rosary will cause virtue and good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God; it will withdraw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire for eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.
5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall not perish.
6. Whoever shall recite the Rosary devoutly, applying himself to the consideration of its sacred mysteries, shall never be conquered by misfortune. God will not chastise him in His justice, he shall not perish by an unprovided death; if he be just, he shall remain in the grace of God, and become worthy of eternal life.
7. Whoever shall have a true devotion for the Rosary shall not die without the sacraments of the Church.
8. Those who are faithful to recite the Rosary shall have during their life and at their death the light of God and the plenitude of His graces; at the moment of death they shall participate in the merits of the saints in paradise.
9. I shall deliver from Purgatory those who have been devoted to the Rosary.
10. The faithful children of the Rosary shall merit a high degree of glory in Heaven.
11. You shall obtain all you ask of me by the recitation of the Rosary.
12. All those who propagate the Holy Rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities.
13. I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the advocates of the Rosary shall have for intercessors the entire celestial court during their life and at the hour of death.
14. All who recite the Rosary are my sons and daughters, and brothers and sisters of my only Son Jesus Christ.
15. Devotion of my Rosary is a great sign of predestination.
